**Sub: -Case No.- 7933/2020** Prior Environmental Clearance for **Stone Quarry (Opencast Manual/Semi-Mechanized Method)** in an area of 4.50 ha. for production capacity of 42,180 cum per annum at Khasra No. 2 Part at Village - Barkheda Bondar, Tehsil - Huzur, Dist. Bhopal (MP) by M/s Shri Balaji Infra Buildcon, Partner, Shri Akshay Bansal, House No. A-1, Panchwati Colony, Dist. Bhopal, MP - 462030.

This has reference to your letter received in SEIAA office on 28.06.2021 and subsequent letters seeking Prior Environmental Clearance for the above project under the EIA Notification, 2006. The proposal has been appraised as per prescribed procedure in the light of provisions under the EIA Notification, 2006 on the basis of the mandatory documents enclosed with the application viz., the Form - I, Pre-Feasibility Report, ToR and subsequently submission of EIA, Public Hearing and the additional clarifications furnished in response to the observations of the State Expert Appraisal Committee (SEAC) and State Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) constituted by the competent Authority.

II. It has been noted that the proposal is for **Stone Quarry** in an area of 4.50 ha. The mining lease area is located in Khasra No. 2 Part at Village - Barkheda Bondar, Tehsil - Huzur, Dist. Bhopal (M.P.). There is no National Park/Sanctuary within 10 Km radius. There is no forest boundary within 250m. It lies at geographical co-ordinates at latitude 23°18'51.67" to 23°18'58.52"N and longitude 77°16'50.59" to 77°16'30.35"E as per mining plan.

The proposed project is for production capacity 42,180 cum per annum. The mining will be carried out by Opencast Manual/Semi-Mechanized Method. The total water requirement is 5 KLD (1.0 KLD for Domestic use/ Drinking + 2.5 KLD for Dust suppression + 1.5 KLD for Green Belt). The water requirement will be met from hired tankers. The public hearing was conducted at Village - Barkheda Bondar, Tehsil - Huzur, Dist. - Bhopal on dtd. 15.04.2021, under Chairmanship of Additional Collector, Bhopal (MP).

III. The project has been considered in accordance with the provisions of the EIA notification issued by the Ministry of Environment & Forests vide S.O. 1533 (E), dated 14th September 2006.

IV. Based on the information submitted, as at Para (II) above and others the State Level Environment Impact Assessment Authority (SEIAA) considered the case in its 680<sup>th</sup> meeting dtd.

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03.08.2021 and decided to accept the recommendations of 502<sup>nd</sup> SEAC meeting dtd. 06.07.2021.

Hence, Prior Environmental Clearance is granted Stone Quarry (Opencast Manual/Semi-Mechanized Method) in an area of 4.50 ha. for production capacity of 42,180 cum per annum at Khasra No. 2 Part at Village - Barkheda Bondar, Tehsil - Huzur, Dist. Bhopal (MP) to M/s Shri Balaji Infra Buildcon, Partner, Shri Akshay Bansal, House No. A-1, Panchwati Colony, Dist. Bhopal-462030, MP. As per the Office of Collector (Mining Division), Bhopal vide order dated 28-01-2019 the validity of lease is sanctioned for 10 years, hence, this EC is valid up to 27.01.2029, subject to the compliance of following specific conditions as recommended by SEIAA & SEAC and subsequent Standard Conditions.

#### A. Specific Conditions

1. Before commencing mining activity fencing shall be carried out all around the lease area. Proper watch and ward arrangements should be made with installation of cautionary signage at 4 corners of lease area to avoid any untoward incident involving public and animals.
2. Plantation programme as mentioned in EIA/EMP and presented during presentation in SEIAA & SEAC shall be followed in content and spirit.
3. PP shall demarcate a barrier zone of 7.5 m as no mining zone in the periphery of mining lease area and develop a green belt. Three rows plantation shall be carried out in the greenbelt area in the current year with proper watering arrangement.
4. PP shall plant 5500 saplings of at least three years old, for the next five years of suitable tree species like Sisham, Neem, Pipal, Sissoo, Bargad, Aonla, Mango, Kathal, Khamer, Katang Bamboo, Imili, Bel, Kaitha, Amla, Harra, Bahera, Nimbu etc. along the barrier zone, approach road, non mining area of lease area, Govt. Primary school of Barkheda Bondar village under "Ankur scheme" of Govt. of M.P. in consultation with appropriate authority.
5. The mining operation shall be restricted to above ground water table. In case of working below the ground water table, approval of the Central Ground Water Board shall be obtained.
6. PP shall ensure installation of cautionary signages on transportation routes for avoidance of accidents.
7. PP shall ensure minimum three rows dense plantation towards the police academy and towards prominent wind direction.
8. Proper landscape planning should be done along with its sincere implementation.
9. PP shall ensure to get the details incorporated as per sanctioned lease/EC in the DSR approved by the Directorate of Geology & Mining, Govt. of MP, failing which this EC shall be revoked.
10. The overburden and waste will be stacked within the mining lease area and should be simultaneously backfilled in the mined out area for plantation.
  1. No overburden will be dumped outside the mining lease area.
11. PP shall ensure the generation of employment opportunities in nearby Village on priority basis.
12. Payments of wages to the workers shall be done in consonance with the provisions in the labour laws. Proper infrastructure with shelter, drinking water, toilet and first-aid facilities shall be provided for the laborers. A provision should be made to construct a pakka rest shelter along with toilet and drinking water facility.
13. Mining shall be limited to the area as shown in surface plan and as per the approved mining plan.
14. PP shall ensure proper watering arrangements for plantations especially in the summer season.



15. PP shall ensure proper implementation of plantation, dust suppression, construction of approach roads and maintenance of existing pakka road as per approved Environmental Management Plan. Adequate budget provision shall be made as part of EMP.
16. PP must ensure the implementation and compliance of the commitment made in Public Hearing in addition to following activities with separate budget provisions under CER :
- ❖ To provide 2000L overhead tank with proper water channelization system.
  - ❖ Installation of solar street lights (02 nos) as per the requirement of govt. school (to demonstrate use of alternate source of electricity).
  - ❖ Construction of boundary wall (35m x 2m height) of Govt. Primary School at village Barkheda Bondar.
  - ❖ Distribution of Mask & Hand Sanitizer for villagers of Gram Panchayat, Barkheda Bondar
  - ❖ Development of grazing land
  - ❖ 30 Fruit bearing trees of different species will be planted in Barkheda Bondar village School.
- PP shall ensure contribution of funds under Jal Jeevan Mission in consultation with Janpad Panchayat and PHED. PP shall give preference to develop/provide appropriate infrastructural facilities in schools or anganwadis of above village. The modification to the above activities can be made with the permission of the district administration and need based activity for the development of nearby villages shall be implemented by PP in consultation with the District Collector and Gram Panchayat.**
17. PP should ensure to submit half yearly compliance report, Plantation and CER activity report along with photographs of all activities in MP-SEIAA. If PP is failed to upload or submit two consecutive half yearly compliance reports of EC conditions to concerned authority (SEIAA and Regional Office, MoEF&CC, GoI, Bhopal) than prior environmental clearance issued to PP will automatically be treated as cancelled/ revoked as per SEIAA Office Memorandum No. 930/SEIAA/2019 dated 30.05.2019.
18. In case the ownership is changed, EC should be immediately transferred to the new owner. Without transfer of EC, the EC stands in abeyance, till the transfer of EC to the new owner is approved by SEIAA.
19. A budgetary provision for Environmental management Plan of Rs. 14.69 Lakh as capital and Rs 05.78Lakh/year as recurring has proposed by PP.
20. Khus slips shall be planted on the banks of tributary for bank stabilization and check soil erosion.
21. Dense plantation/ Wood Lot shall be developed (using "Miyawaki Technique") in 7.5m barrier zone left for plantation.
22. Before onset of monsoon season, 05 saplings per household of fodder / native fruit bearing species (such as Imlı, Bel, Kaitha, Bahera, Amla, Nimbu, Kathal, Mango, Katang bamboo etc) shall be distributed in nearby villagers to promote plantation and shall be procured from social forestry nursery/ Government Horticulture nursery. This activity shall be carried out under Govt. of Madhya Pradesh "ANKUR YOJNA" by registering individual villagers in it.
23. Plantation shall be carried out through Govt. agency (such as Van Vikas Nigam) / Gram Panchayat / Forest Department / Agricultural department by transferring proportionate funds to them.
24. Mining should be carried out as per the submitted land use plan and approved mine plan.
25. The lease boundary should be clearly demarcated at site with the given co-ordinates by pillars and fenced from all around the site. Necessary safety signage & caution boards shall be displayed at mine site.
26. Overhead sprinklers arrangements with solar pumps should be provided for dust suppression at the exit of the lease area and fixed types sprinklers on the evacuation road. PP should maintain a log book wherein daily details of water sprinkling and vehicle movement are recorded.

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27. Transportation of material shall only be done in covered & PUC certified vehicles with required moisture to avoid fugitive emissions. Transportation of minerals shall not be carried out through forest area without permissions from the competent authority.
28. Mineral evacuation road shall be made pucca (WBM/black top) by PP.
29. Necessary consents shall be obtained from MPPCB and the air/water pollution control measures have to be installed as per the recommendation of MPPCB.
30. Crusher with inbuilt APCD & water sprinkling system shall be installed minimum 100 meters away from the road and 500 meters away from the habitations only after the permissions of MP Pollution Control Board with atleast 03 meters high wind breaking wall of suitable material to avoid fugitive emissions.
31. Working height of the loading machines shall be compatible with bench configuration.
32. Slurry Mixed Explosive (SME) shall be used instead of solid cartridge.
33. The OB shall be reutilized for maintenance of road. PP shall bound to comply the final closure plan as provided in Mining Plan duly approved by the competent authority
34. Thick plantation shall be carryout in the periphery/barrier zone of the lease, mineral evacuation road and common area in the village. Top soil shall be simultaneously used for the plantation within the lease area and no OB/dump shall be stacked outside the lease area. PP would maintain the plants for five years including casualty replacement. PP should also maintain a log book containing annual details of tree plantation and causality replacement and to take adequate precautions so as not to cause any damage to the flora and fauna during mining operations.
35. Appropriate activities shall be taken up for social up-liftment of the area. Funds reserved towards the same shall be utilized through Gram Panchayat/competent authority.
36. Six monthly occupational health surveys of workers shall be carryout and all the workers shall be provided with necessary PPE's. Mandatory facilities such as Rest Shelters, First Aid, Proper Fire Fighting Equipments and Toilets (separate for male & female) shall also be provided for all the mine workers and other staff. Mine's site office, rest shelters etc shall be illuminated and ventilated through solar lights.
37. A separate bank account should be maintained for all the expenses made in the EMP and CER activities by PP for financial accountability and these details should be provided in Annual Environmental Statement. In case the allocated EMP budget for mitigative measures to control the pollution is not utilized fully, the reason of under utilization of budgetary provisions for EMP should be addressed in annual return.
38. Fund should be exclusively earmarked for the implementation of EMP through a separate bank account.
39. To avoid vibration, no overcharging shall be carried out during blasting and muffle blasting shall be adopted. Blasting shall be carried out through certified blaster only and no explosive will be stored at mine site without permission from the competent authority.
40. Blasting shall be carried out only during day time and PP must ensure that biological clock of the nearby villager is not disturbed due to mining operation.
41. Mine water should not be discharged from the lease and be used for sprinkling & plantations. For surface runoff and storm water garland drains and settling tanks (SS pattern) of suitable sizes shall be provided.
42. All garland drains shall be connected to settling tanks through settling pits and settled water shall be used for dust suppression, green belt development and beneficiation plant. Regular de-silting of drains and pits should be carried out.
43. PP shall be responsible for discrepancy (if any) in the submissions made by the PP to SEAC & SEIAA.



44. The amount towards reclamation of the pit and land in MLA shall be carried out through the mining department. The appropriate amount as estimated for the activity by mining department has to be deposited with the Collector to take up the activity after the mine is exhausted.
45. NOC of Gram Panchayat should be obtained for the water requirement and forest department before uprooting any trees in the lease area. PP shall take Socio-economic activities in the region through the 'Gram Panchayat'.
46. The leases which are falling <250 meters of the forest area and PP has obtained approval for the Divisional Level Commissioner committee, all the conditions stipulated by Divisional Level Commissioner committee shall be fulfilled by the PP.
47. The validity of the EC shall be as per the provisions of EIA Notification subject to the following: Expansion or modernization in the project, entailing capacity addition with change in process and or technology and any change in product - mix in proposed mining unit shall require a fresh Environment Clearance.
48. If it being a case of Temporary Permit (TP), the validity of EC should be only up to the validity of TP and PP has to ensure the execution of closure plan.
49. PP shall develop its own website to display various mining related activities proposed in EMP & CER along with budgetary allocations. Which shall be updated every 03 months? All the six monthly progress report shall also be uploads on this website along with MoEF&CC & SEIAA, MP with relevant photographs of various activities such as garland drains, settling tanks, plantation, water sprinkling arrangements, transportation & haul road etc. PP or Mine Manager shall be made responsible for its maintenance & regular updation.
50. All the soil queries, the maximum permitted depth shall not exceed 02 meters below general ground level & other provisions laid down in MoEF&CC OM No. L-11011/47/2011-IA.II(M) dated 24/06/2013.
51. The mining lease holders shall after ceasing mining operation, undertake re-grassing the mining area and any other area which may have been disturbed due to their mining activities and restore the land to a condition which is fit for growth of fodder, flora , fauna etc. Moreover, A separate budget in EMP & CER shall maintained for development and maintenance of grazing land as per the latest O.M dated 16/01/2020.
52. The project proponent shall follow the mitigation measures provided in MoEFCCs Office Memorandum No. Z-11013/57/2014-IA. II (M) dated 29th October 2014, titled "Impact of mining activities on Habitations-issues related to the mining Projects wherein Habitations and villages are the part of mine lease areas or Habitations and villages are surrounded by the mine lease area".
53. Authorization (if required) under Hazardous and Other Wastes (Management and Transboundary Movement) Rules, 2016 should be obtained by the PP if required.

#### A. Standard Conditions

1. Valid postal address of the PP with e-mail details.
2. Any change in the corressondance address be duly intimated to all the regulatory authority within 30 days of such change.
3. GPS coordinate of the mine lease area be reflected in the EC for the ease of monitoring.
4. A display board with following details of the project is mandatory at the entry to the mine.
  - a) Lease owner's details; Name, Contact details etc.
  - b) Mining Lease area of the project (in ha.)
  - c) Production capacity of the project.
5. Controlled blasting techniques, as and when required, shall be carried out in the day time only.
6. Mining will be carried out as per the approved Mining Plan. In case of any violation of Mining Plan the Environmental Clearance given by SEIAA will stand cancelled.



7. Effective safeguard measures, such as regular water sprinkling shall be carried out in critical areas prone to air pollution and having high levels of particulate matter such as loading and unloading point and all transfer points.
8. Where the quarry is in a hilly terrain and where some part of the hill is already cut for quarrying, further hill cutting shall not be done. In such cases, deepening the existing operational area may be preferably done.
9. Precise mining area will be jointly demarcated at site by officials of Mining/Revenue department prior to mining operations for all proposals under consideration.
10. The lease holder shall obtain necessary prior permission of the competent authorities for drawal of requisite quantity of water (surface water and groundwater), if required for the project.
11. Parking of vehicles should not be made on public places.
12. Special Measures shall be adopted to prevent the nearby settlements from the impacts of mining activities. Maintenance of roads through which transportation of minor minerals is to be undertaken, shall be carried-out regularly.
13. Measures for prevention and control of soil erosion and management of silt shall be undertaken.
14. Trenches / garland drains shall be constructed at foot of dumps to arrest silt from being carried to water bodies.
15. The project proponent will ensure necessary protection measures around the mine pit, waste dumps and garland drain.
16. Top soil / solid waste shall be stacked properly with proper slope and adequate safeguards and shall be utilized for backfilling (wherever applicable) for reclamation and rehabilitation of mined out area.
17. Plantation programme shall be carried out as per EMP. Self sustenance of the vegetation should be ensured. No tree-felling shall be done in the leased area, except only with the permission from competent authority.
18. The vehicles transporting minerals shall be covered with a tarpaulin or other suitable enclosures so that no dust particles / fine matters escape during the course of transportation.
19. Project Proponent shall ensure appropriate arrangement for shelter and drinking water for the mine workers.
20. Persons working in dusty areas shall be provided with protective respiratory devices and they shall also be imparted adequate training and information on safety and health aspects.
21. Dispensary facilities for first-aid shall be provided at site.
22. A copy of the environmental clearance shall be submitted by the Project Proponent to the Heads of the Local Bodies, Panchayat and Municipal Bodies, as applicable, in addition to the relevant officers of the Government
23. The Ministry or any other competent authority may alter/modify the conditions or stipulate any further condition in the interest of environment protection.
24. Concealing factual data or submission of false/fabricated data and failure to comply with any of the conditions mentioned above may result in withdrawal of this clearance and attract action under the provisions of Environment (Protection) Act, 1986.
25. Any appeal against this prior environmental clearance shall lie with the Green Tribunal, if necessary, within a period of 30 days as prescribed under Section 16 of the National Green Tribunal Act, 2010


