The Proponent has been sanctioned a mining lease for Iron, Manganese, Laterite and Ochure in Jabalpur District. Mining is a job of specialists. In this case four ores are proposed to be extracted. It is not necessary that the agency has specialization of mining and segregation for all four ores.

In discussions it was revealed that a mountainous land will be completely dug out and removed and will be converted into a 33 Ha big pond. In this way the complete topography will be changed and it seems that there will not be left any over-burden. It is not clear that where will the green belt be created and how 33% area will be taken up for plantations. This type of mining is going to change the complete topography of the site and subsequently going to affect the environment of the locality.

Mining of every product coming in way is not understandable. Had there been only one important ore mining resulting into a big pond the situation would be different and considerable.

I feel that in such mining cases where every product coming in way is proposed to be removed should not be granted 'environmental clearance'. It is not only case of this type and I have the same opinion for all such cases also.
