The 14th meeting of the Second State Expert Appraisal Committee (SEAC-II) for mining projects was held on 22th March, 2016 under the Chairmanship of Dr. Navin Chandra for discussion on the query responses submitted by the PP and the projects / issues received from SEIAA. The following members attended the meeting-

The Chairman welcomed all the members of the Committee and thereafter agenda items were taken up for deliberations.

1. <u>Case No. – 2626/2015 Shri Pradeep Kumar Mittal, Director, M/s Balaji Marble and Tiles</u> <u>Pvt. Ltd., 11-12, Dunne Market, Jabalpur Road, Bargawan, Distt.-Katni (M.P.)-483501.</u> <u>Chokra River Sand Quarry Lease Area - 5.500 ha.Capacity -1,56,750 cum/year, at Khasra</u> <u>no.-381, Vill.-Chokra, Teh.-Singrauli, Distt.- Singrauli (M.P.)</u>

This is case of Chokra River Sand Quarry. The application was forwarded by SEIAA to SEAC for appraisal. The proposed site is at Khasra no.-381, Vill.-Chokra, Teh.-Singrauli, Distt.-Singrauli (M.P.) 5.500 ha. The project requires prior EC before commencement of any activity at site.

PP has submitted a copy of approved Mining Plan, letter from Mining Officer certifying the leases within 1000 meters radius around the site and requisite information in the prescribed format duly verified by the Tehsildar and DFO. Concerned Mining Officer vides letter no.1608, dated: -22/08/15, has reported that there is no more mine operating or proposed within 1000 meters around the said mine.

The case was presented in 227th SEAC meeting dated 19/09/2015 wherein after deliberations it was observed that the production of 1,56,750 cum/year of sand is proposed but in mining plan evacuation of such excess quantity is not addressed properly. Thus PP was asked to submit revised evacuation plan with a copy of Khasra panchshala and recent photographs.

PP has submitted the desired documents and the case was presented in the 231^{st} . SEAC meeting dated 27/10/2015 wherein after deliberation and presentation by PP, it was observed by committee that >50% of lease area falls in the water as per the co-ordinates provided by the PP Google image which is of pre monsoon season and mid stream mining is not allowed and thus the entire area does not seem to be minable. The photographs presented by the PP clearly indicated that no sand is available. Hence, committee after deliberations restricted the quantity to 75,000 cum/year.

The EMS and other submissions made by the PP were found to be satisfactory and acceptable, hence committee decided to recommend the case for grant of prior EC subject to the following special conditions in addition to the standard conditions at annexure $\exists B\alpha$

1. Production of Stone not exceeding 75,000 cum/year as per mine plan.

SEIAA vide letter no. 11664/SEIAA/16 dated 01/03/2016 has sent back the file to SEAC for reappraisal of the case in compliance of Honøble NGT order dated 27/01/2016 wherein it is stated that :-

"It has been prayed that the application submitted by the Appellant for the grant of EC for 1.56 lakh cubic meters of sand was considered and EC has been granted for half the quantity without assigning any reason. It has been submitted that the Appellant has made a representation for being permitted to surrender the EC and in the alternate the EC for full capacity may be directed after due consideration. It has been submitted that despite the fact that representation was submitted on 02.12.2015, no decision has been taken so far.

Vide our order dated 23.12.2015, we had issued notice to the Respondents including SEIAA. However, no reply has been filed so far.

This Tribunal in Appeal No. 53/2015 in the matter of Rajamal Vs. MP SEIAA & Ors., while considering the matter pertaining to grant of ECs by SEIAA upon the recommendations of SEAC, has already directed that in the light of the Circular dated 24.12.2013, one of the relevant consideration for the grant of EC should be based upon the consideration of the annual replenishment of sand in the area and not merely on the basis of availability of resource. Since, from the record, it is not known whether the order has been passed in favour of the Appellant directing EC for less than half of the quantity as prayed, has been based upon any of the aforesaid consideration, we would direct that a fresh order by SEAC on the aforesaid principles be passed and based upon the said recommendations, SEIAA to take a decision in the matter. The impugned order, as prayed by the Learned Counsel for the Appellant is set aside. Since, no mining activity has been commenced, so far, we direct that a decision in this behalf be taken by the authorities as early as possible and preferably within 60 days of communication of this order by the Appellant.

The SEIAA is accordingly directed to decide the application in accordance with law. The Appeal No. 55/2015 accordingly stands disposed of".

The case was scheduled for the presentation and discussion but neither the Project Proponent (PP) nor his representative was present to explain the query which might be raised or to make any commitment which may be desired by the committee during the deliberation. Committee decided to call the PP in the next meetings of SEAC for compliance of Honøble NGT order dated 27/01/2016.

Jasalpur River Sand Mine Lease Area - 10.00 Ha., Capacity - 2,50,000 <u>cum/year, at Khasra no.-691/1, Vill.-Jasalpur, Teh.- Hoshangabad, District-Hoshangabad</u> (M.P.)

This is case of Jasalpur River Sand Mine. The application was forwarded by SEIAA to SEAC for appraisal. The proposed site is at Khasra no.-691/1, Vill.-Jasalpur, Teh.- Hoshangabad, District-Hoshangabad (M.P.) 10.00 ha. The project requires prior EC before commencement of any activity at site.

PP has submitted a copy of approved Mining Plan, letter from Mining Officer certifying the leases within 1000 meters radius around the site and requisite information in the prescribed format duly verified by the Tehsildar and DFO. Concerned Mining Officer vide letter no.2864, dated: -24/07/15, has reported that there are 04 more mines operating or proposed within 1000 meters around the said mine with total area of 40.558 ha including this mine.

PP has submitted a copy of approved Mining Plan, letter from Mining Officer certifying the leases within 1000 meters radius around the site and requisite information in the prescribed format duly verified by the Tehsildar and DFO.

Executive Director, M.P. State Mining Corporation Ltd., Bhopal vide letter No. Ret-2/2015-16/450 Bhopal dated 08/09/2015 has submitted a list of cluster of mines existing in the state for issuance of TOR which was forwarded by SEIAA vide letter no 5774/ SEIAA/15 Bhopal dated 26.09/15 for consideration as per EIA notification. As per above list the 54 mines are in the cluster and total area-731.791 ha including this mine.

The case was earlier presented in the 228^{th} SEAC meeting dated 30.09/2015 wherein after presentation and deliberations, it was observed that this mine is in a cluster of mines which is >25 ha and is detailed out in case no. 2922/15 at sl.no. 25. All the mines of this cluster after their individual valid application in SEIAA & presentation in SEAC for TOR can conduct regional EIA but their EMP should be site specific and will be considered on case to case basis.

Being it is a case of cluster where the total area is > 25 ha it was decided to consider this case as B-1 and committee recommended to issue standard TOR prescribed by MoEF&CC with following additional TOR:-

1. Detailed evacuation plan is to be discussed in the EIA report.

As per above recommendations, TOR was issued to the PP vide letter no. 1822 dated 12/10/2015.

SEIAA vides their letter no. 11928/SEIAA/16 dated 18/03/2016 have forwarded the replenishment plan and collectorøs letter (single certificate) of the above lease. As per revised collectorøs certificate which is issued by the mining officer vide letter no. 3829 dated 19/02/2016 it is informed that no mine is sanctioned within 500 meters radius of the said mine.

The case was presented by the PP and their consultant wherein PP submitted that as per the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change recent notification dated 15/01/2016, the criteria of cluster has been changed and now leases within 500 meters are to be considered for cluster. PP further submitted that they have submitted the revised certificate verifying the leases within 500 meters and as per the revised certificate of mining officer issued vide letter no.3829 dated 19/02/2016 no mines are sanctioned within 500 meters.

The committee after deliberations decided that as per the revised certificate of mining officer and considering the MoEF&CC notification dated 15/01/2016, this mine becomes non-cluster and thus the TOR issued for this mine may vide letter no. 1822 dated 12/10/2015 be treated as null and void.

As above, the case was presented by the PP and their consultant wherein the submission made by PP were found satisfactory and acceptable and thus the committee decided to recommend the case for grant of prior EC subject to the following special conditions in addition to the standard conditions at annexure $\exists B a$

• Production of Sand as per mine plan with quantity not exceeding 2,50,000 cum/year.

- District Authority should record the deposition of sand in the lease area at an interval of 100 meters annually in the last week of September and maintain the records in RL (Reduce Level) Measurement Book. Accordingly authority may allow lease holder to excavate the replenished quantity of sand in the subsequent year.
- Evacuation of sand should not be allowed through the roads passing through the villages.
- Heavy vehicles (Hywa) should not be allowed on Kachcha, narrow roads.
- If causeway (Rapta) is required to be constructed for mining. It should be removed completely before rainy season every year.

PP has submitted a copy of approved Mining Plan, letter from Mining Officer certifying the leases within 1000 meters radius around the site and requisite information in the prescribed format duly verified by the Tehsildar and DFO.

Executive Director, M.P. State Mining Corporation Ltd., Bhopal vide letter No. Ret-2/2015-16/450 Bhopal dated 08/09/2015 has submitted a list of cluster of mines existing in the state for issuance of TOR which was forwarded by SEIAA vide letter no 5774/ SEIAA/15 Bhopal dated 26.09/15 for consideration as per EIA notification. As per above list the 54 mines are in the cluster and total Area-731.791 ha including this mine.

After presentation and deliberations it was observed that this mine is in a cluster of mines which is which is >25 ha and is detailed out in case no. 2922/15 at sl.no. 26. All the mines of this cluster after their individual valid application in SEIAA & presentation in SEAC for TOR can

conduct regional EIA but their EMP should be site specific and will be considered on case to case basis.

All the mines of above cluster after their individual valid application in SEIAA & presentation in SEAC for TOR can conduct regional EIA but their EMP should be site specific and will be considered on case to case basis.

Being it α a case of cluster where the total area is > 25 ha. it was decided to consider this case as B-1 and committee recommends to issue standard TOR prescribed by MoEF&CC with following additional TOR:-

1. Detailed evacuation plan is to be discussed in the EIA report.

As per above recommendations, TOR was issued to the PP vide letter no. 1826 dated 12/10/2015.

SEIAA vides their letter no. 11930/SEIAA/16 dated 18/03/2016 have forwarded the replenishment plan and collectorøs letter (single certificate) of the above lease. As per revised collectorøs certificate which is issued by the mining officer vide letter no. 3829 dated 19/02/2016 it is informed that no mine is sanctioned within 500 meters radius of the said mine.

The case was presented by the PP and their consultant wherein PP submitted that as per the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change recent notification dated 15/01/2016, the criteria of cluster has been changed and now leases within 500 meters are to be considered for cluster. PP further submitted that they have submitted the revised certificate verifying the leases within 500 meters and as per the revised certificate of mining officer issued vide letter no.3829 dated 19/02/2016 no mines are sanctioned within 500 meters.

Concerned Mining Officer vide letter no.1775, dated: -29/09/15, has reported that there are 05 more mines operating or proposed within 1000 meters around the said mine with total area of 11.40 ha including this mine.

The case was scheduled for presentation today but PP requested that their case may be deferred for presentation in the subsequent meetings of SEAC as all the relevant informations pertains to this case are not available with them right now. The committee after discussion accepted the request of the PP and decided that this case may be placed in the agenda in the subsequent meetings of SEAC.

The case was earlier presented by the PP and their consultant in the 257th SEAC meeting dated 04/01/2016 wherein it was observed that concerned Mining Officer vides letter no.23 dated: 19/08/15 has reported that there are no more mines operating or proposed within 1000 meters around the said mine. But as per the Google image based on the co-ordinates provided by the PP, this site is in close proximity (< 1000 meters) of another site presented today bearing case no. 4169/2015 & 4220/2015 and appears to be forming cluster. Thus PP was asked to get fresh certificate from mining officer clearly mentioning the leases within 1000 meters from the periphery of this mine.

SEIAA vides their letter no. 11881/SEIAA/16 dated 16/03/2016 have forwarded the replenishment plan.

The case was presented by the PP and their consultant wherein PP submitted that as per the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change recent notification dated 15/01/2016, the criteria of cluster has been changed and now leases within 500 meters are to be considered for cluster. Following standard conditions shall be applicable for the mining projects of minor mineral in addition to the specific conditions:

Standard conditions applicable to Stone/Murrum and Soil quarries:

- 1. The amount towards reclamation of the pit and land in MLA shall be carried out through the mining department. The appropriate amount as estimated for the activity by mining department has to be deposited with the Collector to take up the activity after the mine is exhausted.
- 2. PP shall be responsible for discrepancy (if any) in the submissions made by the PP to SEAC & SEIAA
- 3. Transportation of material shall be done in covered vehicles.
- 4. Necessary consents shall be obtained from MPPCB and the air/water pollution control measures have to be installed as per the recommendation of MPPCB.
- 5. Curtaining of site shall be done using appropriate media.
- 6. The proposed plantation should be carried out along with the mining @45 trees per hectare and PP would maintain the plants for five years including casualty replacement.
- 7. Transportation shall not be carried out through forest area.
- 8. Appropriate activities shall be taken up for social up-liftment of the area. Funds reserved towards the same shall be utilized through Gram Panchayat.
- 9. PP will take adequate precautions so as not to cause any damage to the flora and fauna during mining operations.
- 10. PP should maintain a log book wherein daily details of water sprinkling and vehicle movement are recorded.
- 11. PP should also maintain a log book containing annual details of tree plantation and causality replacement.
- 12. The validity of the EC shall be as per the provisions of EIA Notification subject to the following: Expansion or modernization in the project, entailing capacity addition with change in process and or technology and any change in product mix in proposed mining unit shall require a fresh Environment Clearance.

Annexure- 'B'

Standard conditions applicable for the sand Mine Quarries*

- 1. The amount towards reclamation of the land in MLA shall be carried out through the mining department; the appropriate amount as estimated for the activity by mining department has to be deposited with the Collector to take up the activity after the mine is exhausted.
- 2. PP shall be responsible for discrepancy (if any) in the submissions made by the PP to SEAC & SEIAA.
- 3. Plantation shall be carried out on the banks for stabilization of the banks.
- 4. The mining activity shall be done manually.
- 5. Heavy vehicles shall not be allowed on the banks for loading of sand.
- 6. The sand shall be transported by small trolleys up to the main transport vehicle.
- 7. Transport vehicles will be covered with taurpoline to minimize dust/sand particle emissions.
- 8. For carrying out mining in proximity to any bridge and/or embankment, appropriate safety zone on upstream as well as on downstream from the periphery of the mining site shall be ensured taking into account the structural parameters, location aspects, flow rate, etc., and no mining shall be carried out in the safety zone.
- 9. No Mining shall be carried out during Monsoon season.
- 10. The depth of mining shall be restricted to 3m or water level, whichever is less.
- 11. No in-stream mining shall be allowed.
- 12. The mining shall be carried out strictly as per the approved mining plan and ensure that the annual replenishment of sand in the mining lease area is sufficient to sustain the mining operations at levels prescribed in the mining plan.
- 13. Established water conveyance channels should not be relocated, straightened, or modified.
- 14. If the stream is dry, the excavation must not proceed beyond the lowest undisturbed elevation of the stream bottom, which is a function of local hydraulics, hydrology, and geomorphology.
- 15. After mining is complete, the edge of the pit should be graded to a 2.5:1 slope in the direction of the flow.
- 16. PP shall take Socio-economic activities in the region through the 'Gram Panchayat'.
- 17. EC will be valid for mine lease period subject to a ceiling of 5 years.
